

Assistant Director -

Individual willing to undertake special projects that nobody else would take on a bet, such as working one-on-one with the brain-dead actor whom the rest of the cast has threatened to take out a contract on.

Set Piece -

Any large piece of furniture which actors will resolutely use as a safety shield between themselves and the audience, in an apparent attempt to both anchor themselves to the floor, thereby avoiding floating off into space, and to keep the audience from seeing that they actually have legs.

Strike -

The time immediately following the last performance while all cast and crew members are required to stay and dismantle (or watch the two people who own Makita screw drivers) dismantle the set.

Actors (as defined by a set designer) -

People who stand between the audience and the set designer's art, blocking the view. That's also the origin of the word "blocking," by the way.

FAMOUS NAMES OF THE STAGE

Born Vivian Mary Hartley in Darjeerling in 1913, it was not until 1935 that her name was 'revised' by Alexander Korda to Vivien Leigh. She made her first stage appearance, aged 3, reciting 'Little Bo Peep' for her mother's amateur dramatic group. She was a prolific



dramatic group. She was a prolific stage performer, frequently with her husband, Laurence Olivier, who directed her in many of her roles. During her thirty-year stage career, she played parts ranging from the heroines of Noel Coward and George Bernard Shaw comedies to classic Shakespearean characters such as Ophelia, Cleopatra, Juliet and Lady Macbeth. In addition the to Best Actress Award in Streetcar named Desire, she also won Best Actress Award as Scarlett O'Hara in Gone with the Wind. Lauded for her beauty, Leigh felt it sometimes prevented her from being taken seriously as an actress, but ill health proved to be her greatest obstacle. First diagnosed with chronic tuberculosis in the mid-1940s, it was the cause of her death, aged just 53, in 1967.

IN THIS MONTH

Tennessee William's play A Streetcar Named Desire, for which he received the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, had its premiere on Broadway December 3 1947. Directed by Elia Kazan, it starred Marlon Brando, Jessica Tandy, Kim Hunter and Karl Malden. Kazan went on to direct a film adaptation which won several awards. Vivien Leigh replaced Jessica Tandy and won an Academy Award for Best Actress in the role of Blanche.


