REMEMBERING STUART CARTER

Long-standing APS members will no doubt be saddened to hear that Stuart Carter died on 28 May after a long struggle against Parkinson's disease.

Stuart was an active member during the 70s and 80s, serving on the committee as Chairman, and playing an active part both on-stage and off. He was a perceptive and versatile actor, equally at home in Shakespeare (The Tempest) and Ayckbourn (How the Other Half Loves, Table Manners), though his favourite part was the villainous Roat in Wait Until Dark.

It was, however, as a director that Stuart really made his mark: he was responsible for several productions including *The Chalk Garden, The Militants* and *Abelard and Héloise*.

He will be especially remembered for his exciting and innovative staging of Hardy's Tess of the d'Ubervilles and The Woodlanders, which won the Rose Bowl award for the best production of 1982.

Richard II is a 2012 British television film based on the Shakespearean play of the same name. It is the first of four television adaptations of William Shakespeare's


second history tetralogy commissioned by BBC Two under the series title *The Hollow Crown*. It will be broadcast on 30 June 2012 on BBC2.


