A warm welcome to new members Hannah Hosking,who is playing Bridget in 'A Chorus of Disapproval' and to

Town councillors have voted to undertake a feasibility study on an upgrade to Digby Hall, instead of supporting the Sherborne Community Arts Centre Trust's £1.7m scheme to build an arts hub.

THE group behind the arts project says it has been left stunned after Sherborne Town Council turned its back on the scheme.



At a council meeting late September, Sherborne Town Council members voted to accept recommendations from the town clerk to withdraw their support for the Sherborne Community Arts Centre Trust (SCACT) which is trying to raise the money needed to build a new arts hub on land behind Paddock Gardens.

Instead, the council will undertake a feasibility study regarding the Digby Hall with a view to upgrading it and extending it.

Councillors expressed a lack of confidence in SCACT's ability to raise the necessary funds for the scheme which it commissioned five years ago.

Fundraising for the arts centre will continue despite the town council withdrawing support for the project, say the trustees. They have launched an Art@Heart appeal to raise £100K in 100 days before the end of the year. A leaflet detailing plans and how you can help has been delivered to houses in and around Sherborne and will be available to pick up at the Tourist Information Centre and public places.


