Going Home features a mother and daughter (Sharon and Lauren) on a shopping trip; Lauren convinces her mother to go on a date with an elderly man, even though Sharon is strongly against it.

*Diana and Sidney* are a divorced couple: she is an actress, he is living with his lover. Now he claims he needs money from her to help pay the medical bills for his partner, who is dying.

The Man on the Floor A couple are in London for Wimbledon; their plans are put on hold when Anne loses the tickets, Mark's back gives out, and they are asked to move because they have been put in Kevin Costner's suite.

John, Adrian and Kelvin have been working hard on Sundays to build a stage and the Chapel is beginning to look like a proper little theatre.

"It is really exciting to be directing the first play to be put on in the Chapel," said Sylvie Lord, Director. "And, although it's very early days, I'm really impressed with what I've seen so far in rehearsals."

Performances will take place between 14th and 16th March. Watch out for news of how to book your seat.
