
To HEAR (and see....) the carefully chosen, beautiful poetry of the Bard delivered so touchingly was a delight in itself.

At nearly 14, British teenager Adrian Mole is an unrecognised intellectual and poet suffering the traumas of first love, the threat of parental divorce, and spots. If he could only have his mum back home, a date with the desirable Pandora, and his own poetry programme on the BBC, all might be well.

In his secret diary, Adrian excruciatingly details every morsel of his turbulent adolescence. Mixed in with daily reports about the zit sprouting on his chin are heartrending passages about his parents' chaotic marriage. Adrian sees all, and he has something to say about everything. Delightfully self-centred, Adrian is the sort of teenager who could rule a much better world -- if only his crazy relatives and classmates would get out of his way.
