Joan seems to have joined the Players in 1945 at the tender age of 16, just over 10 years after our beginning. Her first role was as an understudy in *Dear Brutus*. When her husband, Ken, died in 1958 Joan took his place on the Committee, on which she served for 12 years. She held the position of Secretary from 1961 to 1966.

A loyal member of the Players for some 70 years, Joan had painted and made scenery, tackled props, furniture and costumes, acted as talent spotter (*Salad Days*) and performed party pieces and parts in play readings from time to time.

She modestly described herself as "quite good at making coffee, delivering letters and distributing posters". In 2001 she was made a richly deserved Life Member.

An active member right up to her passing Joan always sought to contribute wherever she felt able. She will be sadly missed.
