As reported in the last issue of "Noises Off", our summer production of "A Midsummer Night's Dream" had been nominated in three categories for Rose Bowl awards: Best Shakespeare Production, Best Supporting Actor and Best Lighting. So it was with anticipation that we looked forward to the night of October 21st, at the Mercure Grand Hotel, Bristol. We are delighted to report that the show was declared the Best Shakespearean production, and Adrian Harding Best Supporting Actor! Great credit must also go to Adrian Hole, for his nomination,

The Rose Bowl Awards aim to encourage excellence in the amateur theatre within the South West of England. The Awards, presented annually since 1963 and described as the 'Oscars of the South West' for the amateur stage, are open to any amateur dramatic or operatic club in Bristol and surrounding area including Devon, Gloucestershire, Somerset, Wiltshire and Dorset. Award winners are nominated by a panel of adjudicators who are chosen for their extensive qualifications and experience in the amateur and professional theatre, either through performing or teaching.

The winners are presented with an engraved Bristol blue glass bowl at the ceremony, which was attended by some 400 representatives of Clubs entering for an Award. Read on for the citations for our two winners.

#### THE JOAN HAWKINS AWARD FOR THE BEST SHAKESPEARE. CLASSIC OR RESTORATION PRODUCTION
