"THE DEEP BLUE SEA"

Our next event in the theatre will be an informal playreading on April 27th at 7.30pm, hosted by Richard Jones.

Written in the early fifties when Terence Rattigan was at the height of his powers, *The Deep Blue Sea* is a powerful account of lives blighted by love - or the lack of it.

Taking place over the course of one day, the play begins with the discovery of Hester Collyer in her flat by her neighbours, after Hester has failed in an attempt to take her own life by gassing herself. In flashback, some time before. we learn that Hester left her husband, Sir William Collyer, a respectable High Court judge, for a semi-alcoholic former RAF pilot, Freddie Page. Their relationship was physical and passionate, but his ardour eventually cooled, leaving her emotionally stranded and desperate. Initially unemployed, Freddie eventually takes a post in South America. The aftershocks of her attempted suicide unravel even the

remnants of this relationship. By the end of the day, Hester is brought to a hard decision to live, partly through the intercession of another resident of the tenement house, Mr. Miller, an ex-doctor struck off the register for an undisclosed reason. These two outcasts find a curious kinship.

This play is a portrait of need, loneliness and long-repressed passion.
